Global Oil Production

Global oil production continued to grow in 2022 (4.2%), driven by the Gulf countries and the United States. The latter confirmed their leadership position, secured for several years by the exploitation of shale oil. In Africa, Nigeria's production, handicapped by recurrent looting and embezzlement, has been overtaken by that of Algeria.
